#### 6.1 School Session

The School session is set within the framework of the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi. School observes the Academic Session from April to March.

#### 6.3 Timing to Meet the Principal

- Parents can meet the principal on all working days between 11:00 am to 1:00 pm.
- Kindly call the school Office and can fix up an appointment.
- Parents cannot meet the Teachers during School hours as it will disturb the teaching learning process.
- Parents can meet the teachers during PTMs only.

#### **6.4 School Rules**

- 1. A student should carry his / her Almanac to school every day. It must have his / her photograph with complete information duly signed by parents / guardians.
- 2. Students should reach the school at least 5 minutes before the bell timing.
- 3. In case the child is being picked up by a person other than the Parent / Nominee, a prior written permission must be taken from school authority.
- Students who come to school in the care of helpers should never leave before the helper arrives. Helpers must carry ID cards. The loss of an I-card must be reported to the school immediately. In case of any delay, they should report to the school office.
- 5. Students should refrain from carrying valuable items to school. Although every care will be taken of the student's property, the school will not be responsible for any theft or loss of the same.
- 6. Any kind of damage done by the student to the school property within the school premises must be reported to the Principal. Damage of any kind is subject to a fine or payment for replacement / repairs.
- 7. School management reserves the right to suspend / expel students whose conduct is harmful to the other students or to the school.
- 8. Students should greet their seniors and teachers and give them due respect at all times. Bullying and inappropriate language is not allowed in the school.
- 9. The students are to walk smartly in a queue and maintain silence whenever they move about in the corridors. They must also ensure that they keep to the left while walking in the corridors or on the stairs.
- 10. Every student must have a minimum of 90% attendance to be promoted to the next class (unless medically advised to take rest).
- 11. Once a child has come to the school, he / she should not be asked to come home on half day leave or leave for any period. In case of any emergency, the parent / guardian may collect the child from the school personally.
- 12. Students should get the notes, circulars signed by their parents / guardians and return them to the class teachers.
- No student shall indulge in any of the following practices, namely- (a) Disfiguring or otherwise damaging any school property. (b) Rowdy and rude behaviour. (c) Use of violence in any form. (d) Casteism, communalism or the practice of untouchability.
- 14. No books other than textbooks should be brought to the school.
- 15. Bringing electronic gadgets like cell phones, cameras etc., is strictly forbidden.
- 16. Use of hair shaping gel is strictly prohibited.

#### **Assembly Schedule**

Everyday morning assembly is conducted by the respective classes and special assembly is conducted on every Monday as per the schedule.

# 7. Economic and Academic Resources Available

#### 7.3 Computer Laboratories (LKG - Grade X):

DVPS prides itself on having a fully equipped computer lab for all sections. Students have an individual Intel(R) Core (TM) i5-3470 CPU @ 3.20GHZ, 3201 MHz Pentium IV computer with LCD monitors to work on. The networking enables sharing of files and programmes directly through the internet. They have a wide range of software from Tux paint, Pivot Animator, Rapid typing to PC Basic Programme to learn.

#### 7.4 Smart Classrooms:

The classrooms are fitted with a projector and a smart screen, which facilitates projecting the main monitor's image onto the large screen. All in all, it is a dream place for a child to explore the possibilities of the wonder - that is Smart Board!

#### 7.5 Library (Grade I to Grade X):

a) DVPS has a separate well-stocked library with a collection of reference books, Audio & Video educational CDs, newspapers and magazines.

b) The libraries are open during school working hours, and students from Grade I to Grade VIII, have one library period per week. Students may be issued one book at a time for one week. Books issued for circulation have to be returned after a week, during the regular Library classes.

c) Newspapers, periodicals and reference books such as encyclopaedia, dictionaries, etc. are not circulated or issued.

We use our knowledge of individual student's interest and both evidence of learning to create relevant and meaningful learning engagements. Our students receive specific and meaningful feedback about their progress. Our teachers share and refine their practice by learning and working in teams. Mutually respectful working relationships exist between teaching staff, parents and the school authorities focusing on supporting and extending students' learning by providing opportunities to apply their skills and knowledge to enjoy the higher classes.

#### **10.1 Curriculum Planning and its Transaction**

The school has a well conceptualized curriculum based on the following factors:

- 1. Local needs
- 2. Syllabus
- 3. Pedagogy
- 4. Co-Curricular Activities
- 5. Monitoring and assessment

The DVPS curriculum is designed for the holistic development of its students. It is ensured that it meets the development of cognitive, affective and psychomotor domains of learning. The overall flow is defined as follows:

#### Flow of Curriculum planning and Transaction

Step 1: Selection of Books/Study material
Step 2: Curriculum Blueprint (Curriculum Design Process)
Step 3: Year Planning
Step 4: Lesson Plan
Step 5: Classroom Activity

#### Step 1: Selection of Books/Study material

- HOD along with the team of teachers must review the textbooks /study material used in the existing year with regard to the quality of the content, implementation, its transaction and relevance.
- Teachers also scrutinize the other textbooks/content for comparison. Based on defined criteria, books/study material is selected by the teachers to be followed in the new academic year.

#### Step 2: Curriculum Blueprint (Curriculum Design Process)

The Curriculum Blue-Print (CBP) is prepared by the Subject teachers depending upon the school calendar (Open hyperlink by right clicking on calendar). It should include the learning outcomes prescribed by NCERT, Subject Enrichment Activities, Assessment Techniques, Field Trips, Instructional Methods and the number of periods required to achieve the same. (As per the prescribed format)

• CBP to be reviewed by HOD, amendments are to be done which are further reviewed by the academic coordinator and finally validated by the Principal. Subject Teachers prepare curriculum blueprint which has the following format:

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### **Step 3: Year Planning**

- Topic wise split-up along with no periods/dates for each topic and subtopic is planned in Teacher's Diary.
- At least 60% of the annual content must be taught using Innovative and Constructivist teaching methods. The same to be indicated in the Teachers Diary in the YEAR PLANNING SECTION.
- Detailed planning for the topics should be recorded in the lesson plan. Plan of Multiple Assessment (one for each term) to be recorded in the Teacher's Diary in the prescribed format.
- Teachers have to decide the learning objectives for MA, procedure, criteria for assessment and the relevant rubrics for the same.

### Step 4: Lesson Plan

- Detailed lesson plan for 15 days to be prepared by the teachers in the Teacher's Diary.
- The lesson plan must include learning objectives, instructional method, Instructional resources like models, video links etc, set induction, method of recapitulation, assignment and details of constructivist approach and the integration
- Teachers to ensure that learning objectives stated in the Curriculum BluePrint are met properly through the lesson plan. The lesson plans should be submitted to the academic coordinator fortnightly and monthly to the Principal.

# **Step 5: Classroom Activity**

• The record of daily classroom activity, Home Work assigned & follows up to be recorded in the class log book. The log book should be submitted daily to the Academic coordinator and monthly to the Principal.

#### 11. Assessment tools and rubrics for each class and each subject:

A well-structured curriculum should enable the school to follow a procedure of teaching intervention, incorporating assessment, programme planning and evaluation. To achieve this aim, criterion-referenced assessment designed by the teacher is recommended.

#### **Purposes of Assessments:**

- To identify the children's learning needs.
- To help the teacher plan educational programmes for the children.
- To indicate which specific educational objectives have or have not been achieved.
- To serve as continuous evaluation.

#### 11.1 Scholastic evaluation for kindergarten (Nursery - UKG)

There is continued observation for the students of class Nur-UKG. The entire academic year is divided into two terms and the student's evaluation record is given to the parents in the months of September and March.

#### 11.2 Scholastic evaluation for Grade I & II

Assessment is a key component of learning because it helps the students learn and also for the teacher to determine how well the students are doing in class. Frequent and continuous assessments help the teacher to understand the effectiveness of her teaching and if the learning outcomes are effective or not. In order to understand the progress of the child, the assessment should be ongoing and should be accompanied with feedback. Keeping in mind the significance of assessment, certain parameters have been designed for the same. Students are assessed on the basis of these parameters mentioned below.

# 11.3 Scholastic Evaluation for Grade I & II

The ultimate aim of teaching is overall development of the students. It is very important to measure the development and it is done through periodic and accurate recording of growth and improvement in scholastic as well as co scholastic areas. Therefore, it is imperative to employ appropriate and meaningful assessment tools to measure the growth. Pen and paper tests are an integral part of the assessment system. However, we do not rely solely on pen and paper tests to assess the performance of the students as they are not always an accurate way to measure their skill levels. Therefore, for each subject, we use different tools to assess the development of students based on subject specific parameters, following a definite set of rating scales to ensure that there is parity in assessments and evaluation across all classes and sections. # 13. Assessment training needs of teachers and staff at all levels

A regular supervision by the concerned supervisors, HOD's and Subject coordinators are carried out at regular basis, to assess the potentials of the teachers. An observation proforma is maintained to reflect the unbiased feedback of the teacher. Teachers with average and below average performance are counselled by the Supervisors, HOD's and Subject co-ordinators and also provided with required Teaching Learning materials.

- All the staff members undergo need-based trainings every year to upgrade themselves. Specialized trainings such as image enhancement, leadership development, Total Quality Management trainings including six sigma, Voice Modulation is conducted by experts from the chosen fields.
- Teachers are encouraged to seek professional partnership through collaborative activities between various schools in India and abroad. Teachers also establish links with the teacher community globally.
- Teachers are also deputed for various seminars and conferences of academic relevance. Teachers are also motivated to participate in various Olympiads and External exams to improve their subject competency.
- Financial assistance and incentives are provided to teachers for up gradation of professional qualification.

Parent Teacher Meeting is scheduled every term to meet the respective teachers and review the progress of the child. According to our school calendar Parent Teacher Meeting for this year are scheduled on 04 May 2019, 19 October 2019 and 08 February 2020. The parents were asked to give their valuable suggestions/feedback for the smooth functioning of the school. Later these forms are compiled, and action taken/action plan is implemented.

# 16. Pupil's well-being

Dharmambal Veerappan Public School is a school with a difference, where each child is a valued individual and the safety and well-being of each student holds prime importance.

**16.1 To ensure a healthy, safe and hygienic environment for children**, the school will employ the following resources to continue organizing the measures listed at Para 16.2 and 16.3 below:

- Trained and experienced faculty for meeting the student-specific special education needs.
- Implementation of high security standards under supervision of alert and aware staff.
- Child friendly infrastructure, well equipped infirmary with male & female nursing attendants and clean and airy washrooms.
- Well established and fully functional counseling program.

# 16.2 Measures for pupils' well being

- Medical Check-up and Health Camps periodically to address health issues, detection and information to parents.
- Workshops on topics related to health, personal care and hygiene, personal safety, cybercrime, peer and examination pressure, etc.
- Counseling sessions by child/school counselor on group/individual basis to attend to and identify deviations from monitor behavioral patterns and specific aptitudes of students; the norms and take remedial/corrective measures (ensuring mental health and well-being).
- Career Counseling sessions under the guidance of qualified professionals and scientifically designed tests for accurate skill identification and choice of stream.
- Provide first class education with a broad, participative and balanced curriculum to enable all our children to achieve their true potential, so that they reach the highest possible standards in everything they undertake.

#### 16.3. Special learning needs assessment and plan of action

The school is sensitive towards students who have special learning needs and it proactively design and implement policies to measure up to the standards of quality inclusive education. The process through which it can be realised is elucidated below.

#### **Procedure:**

• Identification by the teacher, referral to the counsellor and procurement of parent's consent

Teachers are trained by internal and external resource personnel for this purpose. Such sessions will be periodically held to update the knowledge of the teachers.

• Application of Symptom checklist based on ICD 10 and other standardised psychometric tools

It purports to screen the student further analysis (of their note books work, reading, writing skills and mathematical competencies).

- Interventions/Remediation: It is based on the nature of problem, and provided in the form of:
- Intense one to one academic guidance session with teacher or special educator in case of problem fall short of meeting diagnostic criteria.
- Referral counselling and individualised educational program (IEP) in case where problem meets the diagnostic criteria. Parents would be advised to go for confirm diagnosis and certification from the specialist.
- Special actions like (i) differential instructions in the class room, sessions with special educator and counsellor (ii) educating parents about nature of disability and the provisions by the board for the student with special need (iii) providing exemptions and concessions as per CBSE guidelines in internal assessments (iv) Promptly forwarding application of the parents for concession to the board. (v)providing other support systems e.g., study material,

accommodation, modification or adaption in curriculum or educational environment in the school.

#### • Review of remedial plan and Individualized education program

All the interventional actions will always be in compliance with the spirit of inclusive education.

### **16.4 Guidelines for child safety**

# Steps taken by the school towards safety of children and staff in campus and during transportation

- Supervise the functioning of the non-academic areas like Administrative Office, Personnel Department, Transport Dept., Estate Dept, IT Section, Purchases, Contracts, Safety and Security, Insurance, Lease Agreement etc.
- Supervises the maintenance, safety and security of the school premises and equipment including buses.
- Administrator in coordination with Transport Department should ensure that all safety measures are followed while students use the school buses.
- Administrator in coordination with the Supervisors should ensure that all safety measures are taken in the block as per the guidelines of Civil Defense Department.
- Ensure high standard of cleanliness and hygiene, availability of drinking water, compliance of safety procedures such as fire drill and first aid.
- Ensure a strict control on the use of School vehicles after School hours.
- Ensure that school buses are maintained in good functional conditions, kept clean and appropriate safety measures are taken as per local guidelines.
- Ensure maintenance of bus logbook, record of mileage, repair, expenditure and monitoring of fuel usage.
- Ensure availability of First Aid facility in all blocks.

#### Safety measures taken by school in case of any external threat / attack

- As per the guidelines of Civil Defense Department, CCTVs have been installed in the campus as well as outside the school.
- All exit gates are ensured by security guards and no time during the school hours the gates are unattended.
- Teachers are allotted duties during break time as well as during their Physical Education Period.
- At no time are the students left unattended in the playground.
- Bus duties are allotted to teachers and the students are picked and dropped in the presence of the bus duty teachers.
- First Aid facility is available in all blocks and buses.

#### 17. Supporting activities

Dharmambal Veerappan Public School has a well-drafted plan for co-curricular activities through the year, which is reflected in the Calendar published at the beginning of the academic session. The calendar carried details of class competitions, inter-house competitions, special days and celebrations as well as mega events and functions. In addition to the calendar activities, a number of other supportive activities are organized through the year to enhance the learning of the students and to give them wider and meaningful exposure. The same pattern will be followed this

year. In addition to the calendar events (already planned), the following supportive activities will be arranged.

- 1. Field trips at least two in a year per class. These trips will be mapped to the curriculum, the plan for which will be prepared in detail by the field trip In charge to be duly vetted by the Coordinator and Principal. The field trips will be followed by in class activity to help them relate the theory with real-life experiences.
- 2. Awareness for students on subjects
  - Road Safety Guest lecture
  - Constitution of India Theatre presentation
  - Water Conservation Guest lecture and awareness session
  - Cyber Safety Awareness session
  - Cyber Security Awareness session
  - Health hygiene and Sanitation Awareness session

### 18. How to take care of diversity in class:

#### Addressing diversity in the classroom

Classrooms present myriad of diversities, therefore, every year school evolve educating procedure, to cater to this need. It will help in profiling the student, subsequently, lead to special arrangement which would be made to appreciate diversity and promote equity in the classroom and beyond. Scheme for taking care of diversity in class is presented below:

#### Knowing the students

School has planned to understand and acknowledge diversity right from incumbency of the students in the school. Elaborate data to be collected by admission executive:

#### Administrative department

- 1. Data accumulation about the student from parents, pervious school records and performance in the entrance test/interaction with the teacher.
- 2. Information about the background and family composition.

#### Academic department

- 1. Documented information would be shared with the department head and from there to the class teacher, who will disseminate the filtered (relevant for the subject teacher) information from there to the subject teacher and counselling unit.
- 2. Profiling of the student on the basis of behaviour in the classroom and activity classes (through observation and interaction).
- 3. Other sources of information would be group personality test, learning style questionnaire (development of the questionnaire in the pipeline) and identification of prominent intelligence (out of eight intelligences). Availability of resources would impose limitation in implementation.
- 4. According to the profiling physical arrangements, individualised instructions (as per learning Style), incorporation of prominent MI in the subject taught can be done.
- 5. Analysis at this level facilitates the identification of the student with special needs. These

students are referred for the different procedure leading to a specified intervention plan.

#### **Additional activities**

- Sensitisation activities in the class (students can present information about their culture, faith region etc in the form of presentation or session)
- Special assemblies.
- Session for teachers to promote culturally sensitive .

#### 19. Requirement of remedial classes

#### 19.1 Classes I and Il

Remedial programs are used to address gaps in basic skills. Remedial instruction can help Struggling learners shore up their basic skills. Keeping in the mind the learning ability of the children few remedial steps will be taken up by the school, twice a week during the zero periods, to help children improve their grades. They are as follows:

- Step by step explanation of the concept would be done separately with the students who face problems.
- Individual attention to be given to slow learners and assist them whenever required. 15 minutes extra to be given to those children who have troubling comprehending the language.
- Change the strategy for explanation and try a different one for better explanation.
- Special educator to intervene where child the is facing a problem in a specific are like retention power or dysgraphia (difficulty in copying words down, formation of letters) To inculcate more of visual learning so it is more relatable and helps the child to remember for a longer period of time.

#### **19.2 Primary Classes**

The significance and need of remedial in Primary classes may not be as grave as in classes VI and above but their requirement certainly cannot be ignored. Most of the students in Primary classes may not require heavy and rigorous remediation but they assuredly need regular, short yet comprehensive remedial sessions. The curriculum in these classes being lighter in content, is more fun, activity and experience based, therefore the number of students who require regular remediation is not very large but usually there is a different set of students who need remedial as a consequence of low attendance due to medical reasons or some unavoidable circumstances.

For such cases the teachers will be proactive in monitoring the attendance of the students and their academic performance. Remedial classes will be conducted subject wise in every week. Based on the weekly tests that will be conducted every week, those students will also be included whose performance in the tests is unsatisfactory. The time-table for subject wise weekly test and remedial classes to be followed in the session 2021-2022 has been prepared by the Timetable In-charge as per the instructions of the Principal and will come in effect from the second week of April. The list of students who have been recognized as ones who need regular support in their learning as a consequence of any kind of learning disability has been prepared by the Counsellor and will be updated periodically for the new students. These students will be a part of weekly remedial classes conducted by subject teachers and their performance will be monitored closely. The Special Educator will also conduct class wise remedial sessions at least thrice a week to fulfil the special needs of those students whose needs are not met in the class remedial sessions.

#### 19.3 Classes VI to X

Remedial planning is the integral part of school academics, where students are given equal

and individual attention as a part of teaching learning process. For this year, the remedial planning is done in a more strategic manner taking into the consideration of last year reports and more workable as well as practical approach which will be followed to bring more authentic results for the students and right amount of learning will takes place as per the individual needs, which will be seen in the performance of the children through their pen and paper results. Initially for the two months of the session the students will be identified by the teachers teaching various subjects on the certain parameters or the patterns seen in the children by the teachers. A few are as follow:

- Feedback from the Class teacher given by the end of the year.
- Classroom participation as well as participating in group discussions.
- Submission of work on time. Self-initiative for any task assigned in the class.
- Responding to the questions directly asked by the concern subject teachers.
- Certain pattern of work seen in the notebooks along with class test performance.
- Asking for doubts or clarification of the concepts taught in the class.

After analyzing parameters as mentioned above along with the feedback given by the subject teachers the students will be identified and special classes week wise will be conducted for each subject with more individual attention given to them in a smaller group.

#### 19.4 Guidelines for teachers for academically low performers.

- Create a threat free environment where the child, whose confidence is low, will be able to ask or speak openly also cater to the students with the different learning styles
- They will be taught the content in a step-by-step method.
- Regular review /recap and practice worksheets will be given.
- Small group instructions will take place which will offer individual attention. Along with the peer teaching.
- Regular competition, rewards and giving the responsibility which will be set for these students on month wise basis to get better results.
- Usage of technology (Videos) would also be used for better understanding of the concepts done in small groups.
- Parents will be involved and progress will be discussed on monthly basis. Recap of the topics will be done at home with the parent's support.
- After Term 1 the children who show progress will be part of the regular classroom and would be monitored on fortnightly basis in order to ensure that consistency is there in their academic progress. The students whose progress would not be up to the mark more strategic plan will be implemented for them in Term 2.

#### Guideline for the same is as follow

- Student's goals will be made high but attainable along with the ways to find the intrinsic motivation.
- Controlled practice will be given to the students for the concept taught on weekly basis.
- Students will be taken for some more special test to check for their IQ levels.
- Moderation of test papers, more time devotion during pen and paper test will be given.

Further to the above mentioned those will be taken under special educator along with the teacher intervention to bring the academic results for the students as per the class level.

# **20.** Annual themes/ celebrations/ Events/ Collaboration with other schools: Annual Theme

We at Dharmambal Veerappan Public school believe that Discipline is one of the most essential value an individual must possess to become a responsible citizen. keeping this in mind, the school has taken up annual theme for the year 2021-2022 as "Discipline – The way of Life". The theme is emphasized and reinforced throughout the year in assemblies, classrooms, curricular and co-curricular activities. In order to teach and instil the importance of discipline in one's life the school has introduced Discipline badge system to handle various indiscipline issues.

Regular morning assembly is an integral part of the school curriculum. We wish to put forward every student onto the stage to give them the opportunity to expose their talents, to promote the communication skills and to develop leadership qualities.


